Relationship so far

- **UK-India Tech Hub** UK India Tech Hub initiative was announced with the following agenda:
 - Use digital skills for inclusive and sustainable economic growth
 - Create jobs
 - o Promote cross-border technology transfer in early stage businesses
- October 2019: Hon'ble DCM Dr. C.N. Ashwath Narayan met with British Deputy High Commissioner Jeremy Pilmore- Bedford. Four areas for collaboration were identified: Fintech, Al, Waste management and Traffic congestion
- December 2029: Go Global Program This programme was launched in Bengaluru in
 October 2019 to give Indian tech entrepreneurs focused on the development of tech for
 good the opportunity to hone their skills and build connections in the UK. Four India
 startups have been selected as finalists for the programme and will be undertaking a visit
 to the UK for workshops, market access and other skilling programs.
- February 2020: Regulatory Sandbox UK first country in the world to set up regulatory sandboxes – first round of discussions conducted with the DHC team to collaborate in this area.
- February 2020: Innovation Challenge Fund Research grant to fund innovative projects in Al/Data Science that address social challenges in India was launched in February 2020.
 - £2 million fund was launched for Karnataka startups doing R&D in AI/DS. Startups will have to apply for the fund as consortia along with and R&D partners to avail a grand of upto £ 500,000. As of April 2020, this project has been put on hold due to the COVI 19 pandemic. The project has been relaunched during October 2020 for startups to apply for.
- September 2021: Fintech program Under the leadership of Deputy High
 Commissioner Jeremy Pilmore- Bedford, a curated and customized Fintech program was launched specifically for collaboration with Government of Karnataka.

- Foreign Commonwealth and Development Office (FCDO), Government of United Kingdom and GoK have been collaborating for a Fintech programme to support Karnataka stakeholders in strengthening the Fintech Ecosystem in the State. In this light, a Fintech Capability building workshop was conducted on 7 December 2021 with several departments of GoK on the below areas:
 - Development of Fintech Policy
 - Ecosystem development workshops
 - Build the capacity of policy makers and start-ups
